

Saint Elizabeth Regional Medical Center is pleased to offer video teleconferencing through Telehealth for the Passion for Birth Lamaze teacher-trainer seminar in Lincoln, Nebraska. The seminar will be held April 14-16, 2010 between 8:00am and 5:00pm Central time zone for all three days. While we are experienced in many Telehealth seminars, this will be our first opportunity to work with international seminar participants for this interactive videoconferencing.

In order for the Telehealth video conferencing to be a success, we are asking all potential candidates to register for the seminar no later than April 1, 2010. This will give the Telehealth Director adequate time to check the IP site of the receiving computers and confirm that transmission is successful. Once that is completed, your spot in the seminar will be confirmed.

The best way for transmission for the seminar to occur is for the participant to go to a hospital, school or library in their community/country. This site should have [videoconferencing equipment capabilities with Polycom, Tandberg, or Lifesize equipment](#). If this is not an option, we can try to work with your individual lap top IP address and web cam, but there is no guarantee that your IP address signal is strong enough for continuous, clear transmission. We are willing to try between April 1 and April 13 to make this transmission successful to all who choose this type of participation. All three days of the seminar will also be recorded, should anyone experience any transmission technical difficulties throughout the three day seminar.

The Director of Telehealth at Saint ELizabeth, Steve VanHoosen, is very excited about Saint Elizabeth's opportunity to provide this service. He is very positive that this can be a quality learning experience for those who might not otherwise be able to access this type of training. We look forward to working with Lamaze on this endeavor.
